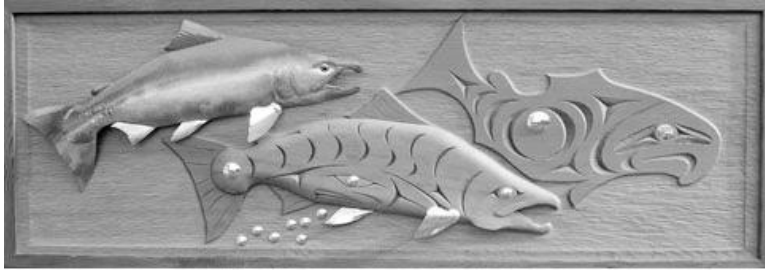


Help protect our area's special qualities! Honor and memorialize people who are important to you.
